In the beginning, this small body of believers was organized into a company by Elder Frank Jones, former Northeastern Conference secretary, on February 21, 1959. On February 27, 1960, the company, now approximately fifty members strong, was organized into a church. Sis. Earle named the church the New York Boulevard Seventh-day Adventist Church.

Since the church was organized in 1920 it has been served by five regular pastors, with two more men filling in with interims of one year each.
