But ethics is a critical element in teaching and plays an important role in a teacher's personal and professional life. A teacher's ethical stance will govern how he or she instructs and assesses students.

Unit 1 - The Ethics of Teaching

Ethics require that a teacher work to maintain a high personal standard of professionalism. The code of ethics developed by the National Education Association warns teachers not to misrepresent their professional qualifications. Ethics dictate that teachers not misappropriate school funds or equipment.

Ethics in the Teaching Profession - Ministry of Education

A code of ethics is a personal set of guidelines that you'll use to determine the right course of action in a given situation. Although the teaching profession has no formally adopted code of ethics, any code of ethics should comprise six basic elements: 1. Knowledge. Possessing adequate and appropriate knowledge is crucial in solving ethical issues.
